Profound and Meaningful Congregational Experience ~ Background in Pastoral Counseling ~ Empowering a Meaningful Engagement with Judaism

Greetings,

By way of introduction, I am a graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary and a member of the Rabbinical Assembly. Currently I serve as both *Rabbi and Spiritual Leader* of *The New Shul of Philadelphia* (www.newshulofamerica.org). *The New Shul* is considered a new and emerging community within the wider Philadelphia Jewish community. Prior to this, I served as the Rabbi of Historic Congregation Keshet Israel, which is an elderly congregation situated in the heart of the Old Jewish Quarter of Philadelphia.

As I note in my resume, immediately after having served as a congregational rabbi in Maine, I then returned to study *Counseling Psychology* at Columbia University Teachers College. At the time, my Columbia fieldwork placement was with two congregations, both of which were going through significant transitions and change.

During that time, I was able to learn a great deal in how to help a congregation maintain its core identity, while also helping to make the necessary changes to meet new challenges. As a result, I feel uniquely qualified to help any congregation experiencing change, especially with Rabbinic change, a new reality which many congregations are facing today.

I would like to add that my wife Robyn is also a Rabbi. She currently serves as the National Director of the *InterfaithFamily Fellowship* program. *InterfaithFamily* (recently renamed '18 Doors') is a new initiative, helping interfaith families regionally and across the country find a welcoming 'home' within the Jewish community.

Many people, upon hearing that we are both rabbis in the same home think that our dinner conversations must be so interesting and theologically stimulating. The truth is that while we do often discuss Jewish issues, we just as often discuss how and what our kids are doing and that all of their homework has been completed for the following day. Of note, our eldest son is studying to be an Orthodox Rabbi and when ordained, our family will have rabbis representing all three of the major streams of American Judaism. We are all different, and yet we are united in our love and respect for each other. All of us, along with our other younger children, see the Jewish people in the exact same way, as a family.

As Ron Wolfson wrote about in his book "*Relational Judaism*," relationships are the new building blocks of the Jewish community and especially important in the transitions we are all experiencing together (synagogues and rabbis alike).

I thank you for your consideration and I look forward to being in contact with a representative of your committee.

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PROFESSIONAL HISTORY

The New Shul of Philadelphia, Abington Township, Philadelphia, PA
Rabbi, Founder and Spiritual Leader (2018 to the present).

- **Creation of an Emerging Jewish Community:** Working together with Jews of all ages and all backgrounds to create an open community based on Jewish tradition, egalitarian values and openness in interaction with Interfaith families.
- **Growth:** Within three months of our founding, membership has risen to over 150 families/units
- **Internal infrastructure:** Within six months of founding we have assembled a teaching staff working with children and adults in both individualized as well as a traditional Hebrew School setting for B'nai Mitzvah and family celebrations.
- **Stage One (a):** Our current phase of infrastructural investment has achieved recognized success in *Teacher Training for Excellence in Jewish Education*.
- **Stage One (b):** Our investment in **Outreach Engagement** is successfully underway with the hiring of a new young *Engagement professional* for outreach to our Millennial demographic.

Rabbi and Spiritual Leader (2012 to 2018)

- **Reinvigoration of Services:** Maintaining the original structure of the service while simultaneously working to create a smoother flow of the overall service. Continuing to expand the involvement of our younger members by introducing individual and family *simchas* into the service. Introduction of special Blessings for those visiting Israel, returning home from hospital stays and all-important life-cycle milestones. Special inclusion of Millennial elements, such as a 'welcome home' for those returning from Birthright and Honeymoon Israel trips.
- **Creation of Outreach Committee with two-fold mission:** Established "out reach" as an integral component of the institutional mission. Stimulated the development of programs to attract new members and further integrate them into the community. Continuing to develop "in reach" to the existing membership in order to transform the quality of personal connections within the congregation itself.
- **Creation of a Parent/Teacher School Partnership:** Served as the driving force to integrate the parents of the preschool community into the Tot Shabbat Program and thereby creating a bridge to more fully integrate them into the community as a whole. Worked to transform the existing Hebrew School program from a Shabbat-only School to a more robust two-day a week program with parental participation.
