As I write this column, we have just completed the darkest day of the yearly Jewish calendar, Tisha B'Av. This particular Tisha B'Av was emotionally probably the most difficult of my life, and I know others felt the same way. The events of October 7th and their aftermath have forever changed the hearts

and minds of the Jewish community. We have learned many things in this past nearly year-long nightmare, but perhaps the most important is a more complete understanding of the fact that diaspora Jews cannot nor should we ever divorce ourselves from the fate of the State of Israel; we truly are "am echad, lev echad" – one people and one heart.

As we move on towards the High Holiday season, we are now gifted with an important time period in which to consider more intrapersonal matters, the Month of Elul. Elul-Zman (time), as it is often referred to, is a time to focus deeply on personal matters in order to get us in the right spiritual and emotional condition to enter the High Holiday season. Each morning of Elul we sound the shofar at the end of shacharit as a wake-up call to remind us not to squander this important preparatory time. We are meant to reflect on the year that has past, what we experienced for good and bad, where we floundered, what we could have done better. We ask for forgiveness when and with whom it is appropriate.

I'd like to suggest that perhaps the person we need to ask for forgiveness from the most is ourselves. We are human, we make mistakes and feel guilty about them. Or others believe we have done wrong, whether justified or not, and their feelings also weigh on us. At times like these, as important as our introspection is, we need to remember what it says in the Mishnah about introspection, namely that in the end we must never see ourselves as evil ("al t'hi rasha b'atzmach"). There is much in the world that we cannot change, though we need always to work to do so. But we do have a prayer of changing ourselves, of using our experiences and our motivation to create better selves. May this Elul provide that opportunity for each of us.

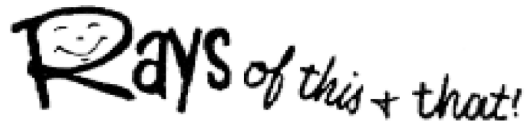

Recipe from Our Sisterhood: Apple Rose Puffed Pastries

Ingredients:

- 3 apples
 - 2 sheets of puffed pastries thawed
 - 6 Tablespoons of apricot preserves
 - 4 Tablespoons of water
 - Juice of ½ a lemon or 2 Tablespoons of lemon juice
 - Cinnamon
 - Sugar
1. Remove puffed pastries from freezer and thaw according to package
 2. Slice the apples in half from top to bottom
 3. Remove the core ends and then scoop out the core in the center
 4. Slice the apples into very thin slices
 5. Fill a medium sized bowl half full of water
 6. Squeeze the lemon juice into the water.
 7. Place the sliced apples in the water and microwave for 5 minutes until slightly tender.
 8. Drain the apples into a colander.
 9. When pastries are thawed, place them flat on a floured surface.
 10. Roll the pastries out with a rolling pin the flatten just a little more.
 11. Cut each pastry into 6 equal slices.
 12. One at a time, spoon apricot preserve mixture onto a slice of pastry.
 13. Place 7-9 apple slices along one half of the pastry slice with the peel side facing out.
 14. Fold the pastry in half to cover the apples.
 15. Starting on one end, roll the pastry and apples to the other end of the pastry.
 16. Place in a muffin tin.
 17. Continue with the other pieces of pastries until you have 12 apple roses.
 18. Place a pan of water on the bottom rack of oven so the bottom of pastries do not burn.
 19. Bake at 375 for 40 -45 minutes.

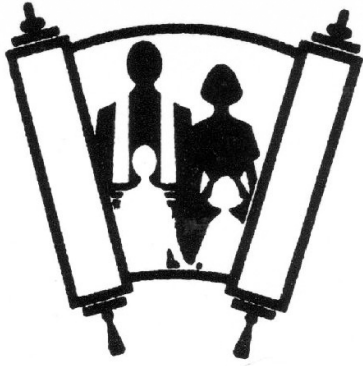
